ACCESS TO GO & LEARNING PLATFORM - single log in

There is now a single log in for use with both GO and the Learning Platform. We know that change can be difficult, but this system now offers much higher security that the old logging in process.

Your new password needs to be 15 characters long and must contain: Min 1 lower case, Min 1 uppercase, Min 1 number, Min 1 special character.

If you are struggling to access GO, there is lots of useful information to support you here.





GROWTH - Running a Recruitment Stall

Now is a good time to be thinking about running a recruitment stall. If it's something you haven't done before, it can be a bit daunting, but we're here to help. Here are our top tips and don't forget – we've put together some recruitment boxes with lots of resources all ready to go!

When you are planning your stall think about:

Where: There are lots of possibilities, and it's worth thinking outside the box. You could approach your local supermarket, have a stall at a farmer's market or attend a gala or fete.

When: Make sure you plan well in advance and let everyone else in your division know, so they can put the date in their diaries. You may also want to borrow the county resources, so you don't want to find they are already booked!

Who: Ask others to help you, this is not something that should fall on one person's shoulders. The more the merrier and it helps share the load!

Costs: Depending on where you are holding your stall you may need to make a small contribution, so you'll need to ensure you include this in the budget. Think about whether you'd like to purchase some giveaways or activities too.

What: You can borrow the county recruitment boxes, but you may also want to have some local flyers or posters printed, or bring other resources. The boxes contain display boards, bunting, table cover, recruitment posters, volunteer stickers and postcards. Plus giveaway chatterboxes and bookmarks. You'll need to consider if there's anything else you'd need.

Finally, think about how you are going to attract attention. Being appealing to children will bring in the adults. We have badge machines and bubble machines to borrow. It's perfectly acceptable to use the opportunity to do some fundraising too. Charging a small fee for an activity for children gives you the opportunity to speak to those with them.

Good luck with your recruitment stall – and don't forget we love to hear how you get on! It's good to find out what's worked (or not worked) for you, so we can share great ideas.



OPPORTUNITIES FOR GUIDES, RANGERS AND YOUNG LEADERS

International Opportunities

Like last year, Girlquiding North East England will be running a selection weekend in the autumn (20 to 22 September) for those interested in being part of an international experience. There are two types of trip:

- International Community Experience 2025 (ICE) (for those aged 11 to 13 in August 2025)
- International Opportunities 2026 (for those who will be at least 14 by the 19th July 2026 and under 18 by the 31st August 2026)





For both trips, there is a ballot to randomly allocate places on the September weekend and then some of those attending that weekend will be offered places on the final trips. This means that participants will need to be confident to attend on their own as there is no guarantee that there will be anyone else they know at the weekend or on the trip.

Application is via an online form and those successful will attend a get together in Norwich from the 8th to 11th August followed by monthly online sessions where they will be asked to give their input on all sorts of topics. Leading residential events

Older Guides, Rangers and young leaders can plan and run their own residential events, gaining a qualification the first time they do it and then being able to use the qualification at future events. This is a great opportunity for them to develop their planning and leadership skills.

Guide Camp Permit

Lead Away Permit

Rangers and young leaders can complete the lead away permit by planning and running a camp or indoor holiday for at least two nights with a group of 4 to 8 Rangers or young leaders. Just like with the adult going away qualification, they will be allocated a mentor to support them. If you have a Ranger or young leader interested in doing the qualification, please contact gaw@girlguidingleeds.org.uk to request a mentor - the initial request should come from an adult leader rather than direct from the young member.
