County Training Coordinator

We are looking for one or two people to work with our training team to help plan and deliver the annual training programme for the County. The training coordinator(s) identifies the training requirements for all volunteers across the County and makes the necessary arrangements to find a suitable date, location and trainer so that these can take place.

The role could be managed by two people, dividing the role into 'essential training' and 'skills & opportunities':

- The **Essential Training (First Response and safe Space) Coordinator** will help with understanding and ensuring the county's current and future needs for mandatory training requirements for volunteers is met.
- The **Skills & Opportunities Coordinator** will help with understanding and ensuring current and future needs for any other training for the county's volunteers is met.

These roles do not involve delivering training, although it would give you an overview of what is involved if you are thinking about your Girlguiding Training Qualification. The administration of bookings and booking venues is handled by our office.

If you already hold the Going Away With licence (modules 1 to 4) and have led a Girlguiding residential lasting two nights or more, you can complete module 9 – travelling abroad. Lloyds Bank Treasurers Accounts

Information from HQ for units with Lloyds Bank Treasurers Accounts

We are aware that Lloyds bank is communicating with charitable organisations – including Girlguiding units – about changes to treasurers' accounts in the new year. Part of the changes include moving to a community account, which charges a monthly fee of £4.25.

Girlguiding headquarters have been in touch with Lloyds, who have confirmed that excepted charities are exempt from this change. The majority of Girlguiding units are excepted charities – you can find out more about this on our website: <u>Charitable status | Girlguiding</u>. This means that the vast majority of Girlguiding units who currently use a Lloyds bank treasurer's account should be able to apply to continue using a fee free treasurer's account.

If your unit has been contacted by Lloyds bank, and told that you will be moved from a treasurers' account to a community account, and you are either: an excepted charity or a registered charity with an income of under £250,000 then we recommend contacting Lloyds as soon as possible. You can get in touch with their community account telephone line on 0345 300 0075. Excepted charities should refer to <u>our website</u> to prove their status. If you are a registered charity then you are likely to need to provide evidence that your income is not more that £250,000 annually.
