Final invoices will be available to download from Tuesday 18 February and all payments must be received by Friday 28 March.

The end of March is also the deadline for getting your signed reviewed accounts to your Division commissioner. They will need to see your signed accounts summary, the signed independent reviewer form and the unit bank details form.

### **First Response**

There have been a few questions raised recently around spaces on first response trainings. Currently we have spaces available on all the courses planned for April onwards, so it's worth checking those dates and getting booked if they work for you. # **Safer Guiding**

We expect most people will choose to complete Safer Guiding as an e-learning, but it can be done via a webinar or face to face training for anyone who would prefer that.

Webinars can be booked via the learning platform. If you would prefer a face to face training, please let us know by emailing <u>training@girlguidingleeds.org.uk</u> and we will aim to arrange one if there is sufficient demand.

The e-learning is divided into four sections each of which has a quiz at the end. You have up to three attempts at each quiz. On the third attempt, if you don't reach the required score, you will receive a message asking you to contact your commissioner. You will still be able to complete the other sections of the training. If it is only one quiz that you don't pass, then please email your division commissioner with your name and membership number and details of which section it was. They will then send your details to the region safer guiding lead who will put you in touch with a trainer. The trainer will discuss the section with you to make sure you understand it. If there is more than one quiz that you don't pass, you will need to book onto a webinar or face to face training.

Please don't worry about it if you do "fail" one or more of the quizzes, as it just means doing the training in a different way. It is, though, worth starting the training as soon as you receive the email telling you it is due for renewal to allow time for the alternative if needed.

# Inspire & Ignite

These sessions are a new initiative launched last year starting with short Zoom sessions introducing different topics to inspire people to take on new roles or develop their skills. The intention is to follow up with further support as wanted.

So far take-up has been very limited, so it would be useful to know if this is something there is





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interest in, but the dates or topics haven't suited.
