- Out & about week 9 to 15 June use some activities from Think like a Leeds Rhino or any ideas you have to have a meeting outside or away from your usual meeting place.
- Region challenge badges there are a few on offer so it's worth a look at the website for details.

- Joint activity with another unit could you join up with another local unit either from the same section or a different section for some games in an outdoor space? This could be a great opportunity for older girls to practice their leadership skills by running some activities and gives everyone a chance to meet some new people.
- An evening at Robin Hole lots of units use Robin Hole for their weekends away but it's also
 a great place for a summer evening. There are places to light fires and plenty of space for
 games or you can borrow some equipment to do activities such as grass sledging, slack
 lining, night line, mini beast hunts, shelter building and archery (with one of our qualified
 instructors). You could also use it to complete activities from the Have Adventures skills
 builder.

At the Trefoil Centre we have lots of resources available for units and volunteers to borrow, including our Adventures in a Box, recruitment boxes and badge machines. We are hoping the new loans system will make it easier for you to see what we have to borrow, see when items are available, and make a loan reservation.

You can visit the library to see what resources we have but will need to register with us to be able to reserve them. It's easy to do, just drop us an email at resources@girlguidingleeds.org.uk and ask to register.

Recruitment resources are free to borrow, there is a small charge of £2.50 for most other items and £5.00 for the larger or more valuable items.

This is new and although we have tested it there may be a few issues along the way, so please bear with us!
