Chargeable On-site Activities

The following activities are available for a charge. All these activities, except for ARCHERY, are leader-led and we will send you further details on booking.

Risk assessments are available for some activities on the main Robin Hole risk assessment, but if you are planning to do any of these activities, please ensure this is on your own risk assessment.

Archery – Archery is an activity where participants use a bow and arrow to shoot at a target, requiring precision and focus to hit the centre of the target.

Only available with GGLeeds instructors. Risk assessment will be shared on booking.

Available from 1 Apr – 31 Oct (please book as far in advance as possible).

Only available for children age 7+

Cost: £2 per head; badges are £1 each (optional)

Grass Sledging – Grass sledging is a summer activity where people race down grassy hills on special sledges with wheels. It's similar to snow sledging, but on grass.

Available from 1 Apr – 31 Oct and dependent on weather and site conditions.

Cost: £30 per session

Soft Axe Throwing - Throw your plastic axes into a target made up of bristles. Can you hit a bullseye?

Outside activity only. Full instructions provided on booking. Risk assessment available, but needs to be amended to accommodate the needs of your group/individuals.

Soft Archery - Soft archery is a safe and fun way to introduce archery the young people will build strength and coordination while learning the basic skills of archery. Suitable for all sections. Risk assessment will be sent on booking.

Slackline Box – Slacklining is walking, running or balancing along a suspended length of flat webbing tensioned between two anchors. Slacklining is similar to slack rope walking and tightrope walking.

Nightline Box – A "nightline activity" is an outdoor group activity where participants are blindfolded and must navigate through a course of obstacles, relying heavily on communication, trust, and cooperation with their team members to guide them through the path, essentially simulating navigating in the dark by using only verbal instructions and senses other than sight; often used as a team-building exercise to develop these skills.

Includes 19 Boggle Blindfold Goggles

Bat Detector – superheterodyne bat detector – a tunable detector where bat calls are converted to distinctive sounds within the frequency range humans can hear. Simple to use and a range of species can be identified. Includes instructions and bat fact ID card.

Den Building – A "den building activity" is an activity where natural materials like sticks, branches, leaves, blankets, and other readily available items are used to construct a makeshift shelter or hideaway, often outdoors, simulating the concept of a wild animal's den; it encourages creativity, problem-solving, and collaborative play while exploring the natural environment.

Box available with everything needed: contents selection of ropes – various lengths/5 tarpaulins (various sizes), 2 mallets, 2 bags of 20 different sized wooden pegs.

Bug Hunting Box – A "bug hunting" activity is an outdoor activity where people actively search for and observe insects, often using tools like nets and magnifying glasses to find and identify different types of bugs in their natural environment, usually with a focus on respecting the creatures and their habitats by returning them safely after observation; essentially, it's a nature exploration focused on finding and learning about insects. Check out the minibeast area.

Gully Run – The gully run is a team building STEM activity –it can be a competition. Create own tracks using pipe and stands to watch the golf ball/water run through. Includes 6 stands, pipes and guttering of various lengths and golf balls.

Gully Ball Game – The gully run is a team building STEM activity. There are 4 sets, so it can be a competition, work together to get the ball from the start point to the end.

Free On-site Activities

The following activities are available free of charge and can be used at any times, if there are other groups sharing the site please negotiate any use with them.

Please ensure any activities used are on your risk assessment. All items should be returned as found to their correct place.

Grass Skis – This activity involves skiing on grass using specially designed skis. It requires coordination, balance, and teamwork.

6 pairs located in indoor store cupboard and 6 pairs in camp shelter.

Giant Games – Large scale games to enjoy: Jenga and Connect 4.

Trim Trail – An outdoor obstacle course, that consists of a series of equipment designed to challenge balance, strength, and coordination, encouraging users to navigate through a set path by climbing, crawling, balancing, and jumping over various obstacles.

A risk assessment can be found on the Robin Hole risk assessment, but please adapt to suit the needs of your individuals.

Climbing Roktagon - A specific type of climbing activity done on a design of interlocking hexagonal platforms and overhangs, where climbers navigate a complex 3D structure with multiple faces and challenging routes, usually called a "roktagon" due to its hexagonal shape; essentially, it's a particularly intricate and dynamic climbing experience compared to standard climbing walls.

A risk assessment can be found on the Robin Hole risk assessment, but please adapt to suit the needs of your individuals.
